

together with the Logos machine translation system.

GlobalWare, which had developed three manager's versions of its translation tool XL8 to handle code, Windows help files and documentation, has now combined the manager's versions into one product and also is now offering XL8 in a less-expensive version aimed at individuals.

There were a number of terminology management tools displayed, including Language Navigator, which supports Japanese as well as European languages and is one of the few such tools available on the Macintosh platform; MultiTerm by Trados and MIX, both of which are now available in Windows versions; Termbase for Windows; and Kanji Base. CD-ROM reference materials finally are becoming affordable: the French and English CD-ROM database Termium, which is produced by the Canadian government, now is available for under US\$500.
